We are finished the Easter season and the hope we have for the work completed on the Cross, and the empty tomb, which brings hope in all situations we face in our lives. As we are entering the spring season and the sun is shining and the snow is melting, my thoughts start thinking of camp. These days of limited outages and physical distancing make me think of the great outdoors of camp, and the friends and relationships that camp has enriched my life with.

So as summer 2020 is around the corner I don't think that there has ever been more uncertainty in the summer program than we are facing this year. In past years we have had problems to overcome and/or staff to find but this year is very different. As we have been watching and waiting for further government information as to what will and won't be allowed this summer for group gatherings, we have had the program committee continue to plan for the summer. We are also planning some online activities if summer camp is not going to run. But as we are uncertain at this time we would ask that you still please register campers as if camp is happening.

The Camp will still have a work bee on May 16. We will follow some basic physical distancing rules and ask all volunteers to bring their own snacks, lunch and drinks as none will be available. We have a lot of trees to cut and logs to split, buildings to clean, leaves to rake, etc. We are also moving ahead with relocation of the boys' cabins and a cabin renewal process. We have new lots cleared on the old road left of the soccer field to build the new cabins as well as move Aspen and turn Pinecone. We want to move ahead with the low ropes course construction behind where Shanty and Trail Inn cabins were and transform an old cabin into the bouldering cabin "rock climbing low to the ground". We also need to move an old cabin and convert it into a Camp swag store beside the gym. We have some slated work on the BMX course to do, install the new double seesaw and grind rail, as well as pack and smooth the track. As you can see we have a lot of work to complete, so if you are in good health and want to come out to camp and do some small projects please contact me by phone, 780-915-0562, and let me know. We would love to make it a whole work week and have the camp open to people dropping in throughout May 18-22.

With all these projects we would like to complete it always comes down to two factors; Money and Volunteers. With our spring banquet being cancelled this year we are missing our one and only annual fundraiser. We have branched out in these different times and started a Go Fund Me page we called "Bikes and Boulders". We set a goal of raising \$3500 and when we reach that goal our camp director Greg has the privilege of throwing a pie in the face of Cameron, his right-hand man. This event will be posted live so everyone can tune in and watch this as it unfolds.

We have also decided to offer a freshly baked pie to anyone who signs up for a \$25 a month EFT for 12 months, or sends a \$500 donation. This is in lieu of the pie auction where you may have bid on a pie and not have won one. Your pie will be freshly baked and delivered to you after the Covid-19 restrictions have been lifted.
