So at PBC we have been working through the highs and lows of Covid-19's summer camp of 2020. It was a real learning curve and a lot of work for Greg and Cameron to transition from a normal summer program to a full online camp. In review of last summer we are not going to do an online camp again. We are planning on opening camp again this summer but watching what the province's rules will be. We will be opening registration on line shortly and we encourage all campers to pre-register. If by May 4, 2021 the rules of overnight camps haven't been lifted we will transition what camp looks like into a 5 day club format, meeting in local area parks.



This spring we have a lot of work to finish before we can be ready for a summer program to run at camp. Last year with the camp being empty we started a lot of large projects that need to be finished. We need to construct two new boys cabins, finish the construction of the new play ground, construct the low ropes course, complete the bouldering cabin, soccer field landscaping, interior/exterior of the new camp store, as well as all the usual spring tasks of cutting trees, clearing trails, chopping fire wood, painting, cleaning, and opening camp up from winter shut down. To complete this large list of tasks we are going to open camp every weekend starting from the May long weekend till July long weekend, for work bees. We would also ask that you bring your own bagged lunch and beverage, for the day. Hope to see many of you out there.

This year we were again unable to hold our spring fundraising banquet. This is our only fundraiser and our largest source of income. Last year we did not run any camps, or host any rental groups for income, but we still paid insurance, utilities, and our two camp staff for their work on the online program. We had our maintenance man working on roof repairs, and camp upkeep to keep the camp in good repair as well as the new projects we are undertaking. Pioneer has touched many lives over the years from the kids that came, to the families they returned to, and the staff that lead them. This Ministry can only continue if we, as friends of PBC, donate. We accept

### Thoughts from the Board

As the weather warms up it leads my thoughts and prayers to focus more on camp. It has been a hard, to say the least, with Covid and with camp sitting empty last summer. As I was in prayerful thought I was thinking about where we came from and the history of the Kushneriks and their call to the missions field of Smoky Lake, AB. I still remember Mrs K. telling us in a chapel meeting that she answered the call to go to the mission field and was ready to go to Africa but Lord dropped her in Smoky Lake, Alberta.

As a board and futures committee we are looking for guidance to have an all season campus and a fulltime director. I thought of the service Dave and Andrea Armbruster put in as a director team and their dynamic of being a teacher all year, transitioning to camp director for the summer months and then back to teaching and the limited break that gave them.
