

Fire at Camp

On May 15th, a fire was spotted coming from Pioneer's property. Emergency fire services were called, and multiple crews attended what had become a forest fire. The responders quickly bulldozed a fire guard through the forests on the south-west side of camp property. Amazingly, no buildings or program-use areas of the camp were damaged. We would like to thank the first responders that worked at the camp that night, and those who immediately began praying for the safety of the camp's property.



The fire started at the camp's burn pit ("Ignition Point" in the figure above), where a (permitted) fire was set in February to burn pruned brush from around the camp. It is suspected that the fire smouldered underground due to a number of tree roots in the area, and was ignited in May due to intense winds. Thankfully, the winds appear to have been blowing from the east, such that the fire spread away from the main camp site, towards the north-west — although some of the field to the north of the ignition site was burnt as well.

The board of Pioneer Bible Camp is so grateful for the Lord's protection of the camp during this time, and apologizes for any conflicting information that may have been released in the few days around the time of the fire.
